What's included in the fees?

Boarding fees are inclusive of all meals, and text and exercise books as well as allowances for tuck and some weekend outings, writing materials and postage for home letters, faxes and e-mails, birthday cake and celebration, dry cleaning, a phone card, a chemist's voucher, haircuts and taxi fares for doctor and dentist appointments. Extras

We try to keep any extras on your bill to a minimum. As a guide, the following are the main categories of **optional** extra charges:

- Activities – the majority of after school activities are included in the fees, but sometimes it may be necessary to charge extra if there has been a need to bring in outside expertise, or where the activity either requires materials or incurs the hire of courts, etc. The charges are kept to the bare minimum and either subsidise or cover the cost of an activity session.
- Holiday trips and excursions (prices vary).
- Insurances.
- Examinations and invigilation.

Entry and Registration

To secure a place for your child at St Andrew's we recommend that you complete and return a registration form with a non-refundable registration fee of £65. We will then send you confirmation that your child has a place, or if the year group is full, he/she will be placed on a waiting list. One year (or less) before entry, parents will be asked to pay a refundable deposit as outlined below:

The deposit is held by the school and is refundable when your child leaves providing that all financial commitments have been met and due notice (one full term) has been given.

Deposit:

Boarders and Weekly Boarders whose parents are resident in the UK £812
Boarders whose parents are not resident in the UK £1,624

Short Stay Deposit:

A deposit, currently £650 for one term and £325.00 for half a term is payable prior to admission. Please note: deposits are held and credited against the closing account.

Notice of Withdrawal

With the exception of Year 8 children who are in their last term, a term's notice in writing is required if a child is going to leave the school; otherwise a term's fees will be due.
